



LONDON BOROUGH OF BRENT, THE BRENT (FREE PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (NO. *) ORDER 202*, THE BRENT (FREE PERMIT PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (NO. *) ORDER 202*, THE BRENT (PARKING PLACES) (ZONE C) (NO. *) ORDER 202*

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the London Borough of Brent propose to make the above mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by section 8 of and Part I of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985, the Parking Acts of 1986 and 1989 and the Traffic Management Act 2004.
2. The general effect of the 'Disabled Persons Parking Places' Order would be to make a minor drafting amendment to an existing parking place in Park Lane.
3. The general effect of the 'Free Permit Parking Places' Order would be to:-
 - (a) designate free personalised parking places for vehicles displaying a Brent issued personalised disabled persons parking places permit issued under the Order generally outside No. 6 Park Lane, HA9 7RP and outside No. 13 Ruby Street, NW10 8SD;
 - (b) provide that the parking places specified above in sub-paragraph 3(a) to this Notice would operate "at any time";
 - (c) provide that a permit may be issued by the Council on application being made by a disabled person in possession of a Brent issued blue badge and:
 - (i) in receipt of the Disability Living Allowance with the higher rate of mobility component for an indefinite period; or
 - (ii) in receipt of the higher rate of Attendance Allowance for applicants aged 65 or over; or
 - (iii) where the applicant does not drive and has appointed a nominated carer to drive for them, the carer is in receipt of the Carer's Allowance award.
4. The general effect of the 'Parking Places' Order would be to make a minor drafting amendment to an existing parking place in Park Lane to accommodate the introduction of the free personalised parking place mentioned in sub-paragraph 3(a) above.
5. Copies of the proposed Orders, of relevant Orders of 2001, 2008 and 2019 (and of any Orders which have amended those Orders), of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders and of maps which indicate each length of road to which the Orders relate can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of a period of 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made or the Council decides not to make the Orders at Brent Customer Services, Brent Civic Centre, Engineers Way, Wembley, Middlesex, HA9 0FJ. **Please note:** - that we are unable to provide access to the council offices while coronavirus (COVID 19) social distancing measures are in place and the documents have been made available for inspection at <https://consultation.brent.gov.uk/highways-and-infrastructure/disabled-parking-to-03-206-np>. - (3) Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2008 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2008 thereto

3. (1) Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and, unless otherwise so specified, having a width throughout of {1.83 metres} is designated as a parking place.
- (2) The provisions of the Order of 2008 (other than Articles 3 and 15) shall apply to the areas designated as parking places by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place included a reference to an area designated as a parking place by this Order, and any reference to the Schedule to the Order of 2008 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs {etc.}

4. The Council shall place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place and that each parking place may only be used by vehicles specified in Article 5 of the Order of 2008.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

The Brent (Free Permit Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Order 2008 designates parking places in the London Borough of Brent in which a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000 may be left. The provisions of the Order of 2008 are applied to other similarly designated parking places within that Borough.

This Order designates additional parking places and applies the provisions of the Order of 2008 to the parking place so designated.

 - "the Order of 2019" means the Brent (Parking Places) (Zone C) (No. 1) Order 2019^b;
- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- (3) Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2019 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Revocation of designation of parking places

3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before coming into operation of this Order, the designation by the Order of 2019 of the parking place numbered 42 and set out in Schedule 2 therein, is hereby revoked.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2019 thereto

4. (1) Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and, unless otherwise so specified, having a width throughout of {1.83 metres} is designated as a parking place.
- (2) The provisions of the Order of 2019 (other than Articles 3 and 15) shall apply to the areas designated as parking places by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place included a reference to an area designated as a parking place by this Order, and any reference to Schedule 2 to the Order of 2019 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs {etc.}

5. The Council shall:
 - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to this Order; and
 - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Articles 4(1) and (2) of the Order of 2019;
 - (c) place and maintain traffic signs in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to this Order indicating:-
 - (i) that the parking place may be used by vehicles making payment of the parking charge via the electronic payment system; and
 - (ii) the location identification number of the parking place or part thereof;
 - (d) install and maintain in proper working order pay and display machines in such positions as they think fit in the vicinity of certain parking places referred to in the Schedule to this Order; and}
 - (e) carry out such other work as is reasonably required by the Order of 2019 for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

SCHEDULE

PAY PARKING PLACES (SEE ARTICLE 4)

In relation to a parking place described in this Schedule the expression "permitted hours" means either:-

- (1) the period between 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Monday to Saturday inclusive, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday, a Bank Holiday or an event day; or
- (2) the period between 8.00 a.m. and midnight on an event day.

Parking places in which a vehicle may be left during the permitted hours for a maximum parking period of two hours, provided either: the vehicle displays a valid parking ticket, or in respect of which vehicle payment of the parking charge has been made using the electronic payment system.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order revokes the designation of a certain parking place and re-designates a further parking place in Park Lane in the London Borough of Brent and applies the provisions of the Order of 2019 to the parking places so designated.
