Islamia Primary School - Active Travel Recovery Plan Temporary Parking Suspension

This document outlines our proposals for an Active Travel Recovery Plan in your area. Please read the information in this document, then complete, and return the enclosed questionnaire - **postage is free**. The closing date for the return of the questionnaire is:

Why are we proposing this change?

As lockdown restrictions are eased, we want to support schools with social distancing. Covid-19 has changed our everyday routine. To comply with social distancing, many schools have introduced queuing systems outside their premises and pavements have become pinch points at these locations.

There is also evidence that some pedestrians are stepping out into the road to get around people, resulting in a road safety risk.

The aim of the scheme is to:

- Help support social distancing
- Improve road safety for all road users
- Help prevent/slow the spread of Covid-19

What are the proposed improvements?

The proposed improvements include:


- Temporary suspending the dual parking bays outside Islamia Primary School, on Salusbury road, NW6.
- Introduce and implement Water filled Barriers on the boundary of these parking bays to provide a wider pavement space.

Wider pavements mean more space for people to pass each other safely. This is particularly important in the current circumstances, where everybody is being asked to keep their distance to slow the spread of Covid-19.
