



As part of our sustainable transport policy, Brent Council is progressively improving key walking routes to schools and making them safer for all road user, particularly for vulnerable road users such as children. This document outlines our proposal to improve pedestrian access to Wykeham Primary School in Ardley Close.

Please read the information provided and let us know what you think about the proposals by returning the enclosed questionnaire - **postage is free**. The document and plans of the improvements are also available online at www.brent.gov.uk/consultation. Only responses from within the consultation area will be considered. The consultation closes on **10 March 2021**.

Why are we proposing this change?

In response to continuing concerns raised by the local residents and school travel plan officers, the Council is working in partnership with Transport for London to deliver a series of rapid improvements to the transport system in the Brent area.

Brent Council has already introduced a number of road safety improvements around Wykeham Primary School. Further measures are now proposed to reduce congestion near the school gate in Ardley Close and to support social distancing of parents and children walking to and from the school.

What are the proposed improvements?

The scheme proposals are shown in the attached drawing.

In summary, the proposals include the following:

- Introduction of an experimental “No Right and Left Turns” restriction on motor vehicles travelling from Aboyne Road into Ardley Close between 8:15 to 9:15am and 2:30 to 4:00pm. The restriction will apply inclusive from Monday to Friday.
- Introduction of a half “Yellow Box” junction marking at the junction of Aboyne Road with Annesley Close to ease congestion and improve road safety.
